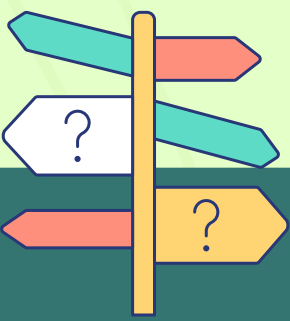


# PROS & CONS OF GEOGRAPHY OPTIONAL
